2020, green cities' year in the Atlantic Arc

In 2020, two Atlantic Cities are at the forefront of European Green Cities. Lisbon, in Portugal is the [European Green Capital](#), whereas Limerick, in Ireland, is the European Green Leaf. Moreover, the Atlantic Cities network is involved in the [EURE project](#), a pan European initiative dealing with sustainability. In December 2019, Ursula Von der Leyen presented the “European Green Deal”, a plan to get a more sustainable Europe.

[Atlantic Youth Creative Hubs-AYCH](#) project, under Interreg Atlantic Area programme, intends to gather this year the idea of Green Cities and provide youth insight through their creativity and prototypes creation. For example, the Santo Tirso International Creative Jam is dedicated this year to the youth prototyping in the field of nature and the city.

As urbanisation and climate change are becoming great challenges for cities, they need to engage to find new solutions for maintaining and improving the quality of life. For example, public green spaces play a key role as well as public transport or buildings with efficient energy.

Therefore, this year, our drawing contest AYCH Kids II will focus on green cities, seen by children. Teachers, parents, legal tutors or relatives are encouraged to help kids to think about the green dimension of cities.

Who can participate?

The contest is open to kids aged between 3-17 years old living in Atlantic Cities from Portugal, Spain, France, UK and Ireland.

How to participate?

You only need to send your drawing scanned or photographed by email your drawing to aychkids2020@gmail.com no later than 30th June 2020.

**Note: Only one drawing per kid will be registered.*

Contest regulation:

Drawings requirements:

- Design style: classic design, collage or comic.
- Drawings must be traditional handmade drawings in paper, cardboard or similar. *"Electronic devices are not allowed"*.
- Original Size: DIN A4
- Scan/ photo format: JPG, JPEG, PDF, PNG
- Scan/ photo Size: Maximum 5 MB

Categories:

AYCH drawing contest is split into four categories:

1. Firstly, kids aged from 3-6 years old.
2. Second, kids aged from 7 to 9 years old.
3. Third, kids aged from 10 to 13 years old.
4. Fourth, teens aged from 14 to 17 years old.

Registration: All participants will receive a registration confirmation email via the contact information provided.

Winners: will be announced on 7th July 2020, the day of the Atlantic Cities 20th Anniversary.

Candidatures: Open until 30th June 2020

Drawing will be judged following the two (2) following criteria:

- ⊗ 50% Quality of design
- ⊗ 50% Originality of design

Prizes:

The first three per category:

- ⊗ Educational material
- ⊗ Dissemination in Atlantic Cities' social networks
- ⊗ A certificate

*Note. We will only award one (1) prize per person

Jury:

Transnational Jury: The Jury will be composed by one member from each eligible country to the contest [Portugal, Spain, France, UK and Ireland].

- ⊗ Institutional Jury: 2 members
- ⊗ Educational Jury: 3 members
